He is risen!

He is risen indeed!

In the time I have had to think it over, I have been fascinated with the idea of Resurrection Sunday (Easter Sunday), falling on April 1st. In much of the world we recognize the first of April as April Fool's Day, a day that practical jokers wait for in anticipation.

I have been fascinated by this, wondering what 'delightful' pranks creative people will play on one another that ties Easter with April Fool's Day. How many Easter baskets will be filled with vegetables and text books? How many grapes will be wrapped in chocolate egg wrappers? How many egg hunts will be wild goose chases?

It could seem like such an irreverent way to celebrate the resurrection. But, is it?

The origins of April Fool's Day are debated. Some say that in the 1500's when The Gregorian Calendar was replaced by the Julian calendar, those who continued to prepare New Year's celebrations for April 1st, were surprised to learn that was not New Year's Day. Another common thought is that because Spring can so often be fickle, teasing you with warmth one day only to cover you in snow the next, that people chose to celebrate that fickleness instead of being angry about it. These theories have to do with being led to expect one thing, only to have some sort of, "Not really", unveiled.

And wasn't Jesus' resurrection the largest, "Not really", ever?

That is not to say that Jesus' death was in any way a joke, Jesus' suffering was real. Yet the disciples saw it as the end, as final, only to wake up to a new and radically different reality that Sunday morning. While it's not a joke, it certainly is something that caught everyone by surprise and made them rethink what they knew. (Something many April Fool's revelers aspire to do.)

There is no doubt that resurrection is a serious thing. Yet, serious does not need to mean devoid of humor. After all it seems likely to me that the disciples were able to find humor in it, even if it took years. I can imagine Mary laughing with others about mistaking Jesus for a gardener (John 14-16). The two disciples who walked with Jesus to Emmaus telling him about, well, himself (Luke 13-35) also would have had quite the humorous story to tell and to relive with each other.

This year, we have a great opportunity to find God's humor mixed into the serious, life-altering reality of resurrection. Without making a fool of anyone, we can look for the humorous situations that arise in life, especially when our expectations are radically overturned.

Wishing you a very joyful and humorous Resurrection Season!

Call to Order: Ron Rock called the Council meeting to order. A motion was made to accept the Agenda. Passed

Devotions: Pr. Rindy gave the devotion.

New Business: A special presentation was given by Josh Doutre from Harmony Medial concerning health screenings. Both Coordinating Committees had approved their program. Discussion followed. It was decided to wait until after Easter and treat it as we do the blood drive. Kim has a draft MOU ready.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the February regular Council Meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Staff Reports: Pr. Bill reported that the cost of the server is more than anticipated. A motion from February was reconsidered and passed to spend the additional funds. Pr. Terry is leaving the end of April and will not be returning as a supply preacher this next High Season. A recognition coffee with cake will be held at both campuses. Digital Sign Company will be demonstrating their sign at East Mesa Palm Sunday advertising Easter week services.

Pr. Tina has been having some difficulty finding contacts for the Agency on Aging to see if we can use their services or training. Family Promise is in residence this week.

Kim McCracken submitted a written report. There will be an Easter baptism at East Mesa and some in the weeks following.

Administration: Susan Drane will be interviewing applicants for the staff position on Friday. WELCA had sent \$2,000 to Puerto Rico. Susan received a response from a friend of hers in Puerto Rico saying they received it and thanks. Three programs were very successful: Steven Ministry presented a harpist; the Spring Tea; and the Rio Salado conference with a talk from Katie Luther.

East Mesa Coordinating Committee: Report stands with two date/time corrections.

Gold Canyon Coordinating Committee: Report submitted. Hand rails are being built. Acoustical panels are ordered.

Evangelism: Ruthie Beutel - The team met with a digital advertising company. Is considering a proposal.

Missions: Richard Falk – **Mission program is set for 2018/19. He is contacting "Packages From Home" for a "God's Work, Our Hands" project in September.**

Old Business: Dave Reurink reported all projectors have been installed at both campuses. The copier from Epiphany was delivered to Gold Canyon. A motion was made and approved for two projects

1. Pr. Tina opened the meeting with prayer.

2. New Business:

- a. Harmony Medical Care presented information on a Comprehensive Wellness Assessment that they offer. Denice Rock had used this service in their park and highly recommended it. They offer 9 different tests: Allergy Testing; Bone Density Screening; Body Composition; Dermatology; Heart Health Study; Lab Service; Pulmonary function Testing; Vision Screening; and Imaging and Ultrasound. These tests are covered by Medicare and several other insurances. A mobile unit is brought on site and all the tests are done in one appointment. After the representatives left the committee discussed the advantages/disadvantages of this program and voted to recommend to the council that Harmony be permitted to offer this service at the Gold Canyon Campus. Council Action Required.
- b. **Cake will be provided to honor Pr. Tina's Installation on March 17th and 18th. Janice will obtain the cake.** Deb will be responsible for serving on Saturday and Janice will handle the cake for Sunday.
- c. Marion is retiring and the staff is being reconfigured. Sonya will not be in the office on Wednesday. We need volunteers to keep the doors open probably through April. Janice will fill in on March 14th.

3. Old Business:

- a. Acoustical panels: Pr. Bill reported that Dave is working with one of the original providers. They will be providing an updated bid.
- b. Handrail: The handrails need a final measurement and then need to be powder coated. The employee that is working on our product is in the hospital with pneumonia. The Council has approved the expenditure.
- c. We are starting Temple Talks/Group Spotlight/Mission Minutes this coming Sunday, March 10th and 11th. The first topic is the Food Bank. Deb will cover Saturday and Janice will do Sunday. March 24th and 25th will be Altar Guild. Suzy will contact them to do a presentation.
- d. Deb Herman suggested that we eliminate the easel because it is cluttering up the wall area. Janice will be sure that happens by this weekend.

4. Pastor and Staff

- c. Kim was absent but wanted us to know that the funds collected for VBS will be shared between both campuses.

5. Ministry Chair Reports (only those with current activity are shown below)

- a. Care – Deb Hermann bought some note cards. Pr. Tina will see that she gets some stamps.
- b. Discipleship – Suzy Cavoto - Hebrews will be the Bible Study for Tuesdays at 900 am. Table Talk **(a book about the conversations arounds Luther's table) will be the next topic for the Tuesday 1030 study.**
- c. Fellowship – The collections at the Soup Suppers have been the best ever! All proceeds are going to the snack packs for the school kids.
- d. Finance We are slightly under collections in January from last year. However we had one less Sunday this year.
- e. Good News- Mike Johnson reminded us that we have the Summer Celebration on July 7th. The menu is still under consideration. Multi Generation VBS is set for July 15th through the 19th.
- f. Property Team – No representative attended. Several items need to be attended to.
 - i. A sign needs to be acquired to announce the office hours.

The committee recommended Wellspring/Harmony to be permitted to hold a comprehensive wellness assessment event at East Mesa. This recommendation will be brought to the March Council Meeting.

Family Promise is at EM the third week of March, 3/18 -3/25

We are also housing Family Promise families the third week of July.

There will be an I-Help informational meeting on Thursday 3/22.

The new sign is over 50% funded. A new sign funding progress thermometer will be in the bulletin this weekend. An example of the sign will be displayed along Ellsworth on Palm Sunday 7am to 11am.

A new projector and sound bar was installed in the conference room. A new projector and sound bar was installed in the youth room. A new projector will be installed in the Community Room. The two additional projectors were donated.

In April, we are scheduling a company to shred our out of date / old Church records and to have the entire congregation to participate.

There was a bid from the Lock shop and Titan for \$8610 for the handicap door at the Sanctuary door, automatic locks at all four Sanctuary doors, intercom / camera at the sanctuary door, and two additional cameras- lobby and wider view of the West parking lot.

A sample of the kneelers and the kneeler templates are done. The technician will be here this Wednesday at 11am to verify. The goal is have all kneelers completed by Maundy Thursday. The youth sold lilies on March 3rd & 4th at EM and March 10th & 11th at GC. 39 lilies at EM and 18 lilies at GC were sold for a dollar amount of \$850 with ½ of that profit.

The youth will have a pancake breakfast on Palm Sunday at EM and at GC on Easter morning. There will be an Easter egg hunt at EM after the 9am service and after the 10:30am service in the court area. Easter Sunday will be like any other family Style Sunday, children and youth will acolyte, and collect the noisy offering. The youth will serve breakfast to Family Promise families on Palm Sunday.

The January Bazaar made \$6,400.00. The monies were distributed as follows: \$500 to the youth; \$500 towards the new sign; \$2000 to Puerto Rico through LSS, \$1000 to a Veterans outreach program, \$2000 to our missionary in Senegal, \$200 to our youth missionary in West Africa, \$200 to our youth missionary in Uruguay, \$500 for maintenance on the I-Help van. Since Marian is retiring, her position and job description was posted. We just received an excellent candidate for her position today.

There will be an insert in the bulletin this weekend. It is a pie chart detailing the amount given by members, associate members, attendees, and loose cash giving. The stewardship committee **wanted to express that any giving matters and to say a big thanks for everyone's support.**
