Ron Rock shared a brief dedication reminding us to honor all those who have in the past, and those who are currently assuring our continued freedom and safety. Also asked for safe travel for all who will be traveling this weekend. Pr. Bill led us in prayer.

New Business: Robert Baker, our neighbor on the southeast side of the church property has requested permission to have a cement truck cross the church land to provide concrete for footings for a block wall he is installing. Robert and Janice have met with him and walked the area involved. It is their opinion that there will be minimal damage provided the owner cleans up after the work is finished. Attached is the letter of permission to the owner with the limitations. A motion was made, seconded and passed to allow Mr. Baker access.

Old Business:

Mike and Kim brought us up to date on the Multi Generation VBS. Dates are July 15 to 19. Volunteers need to be there at 5:45 with VBS from 6 to 8. Price of admission will be a dozen cookies. There will be two talks each night except Sunday and Thursday. Thursday there will be a light potluck. No one is registered yet but several people have shown interest. Set up will be done on Sunday after service. Kim will bring some decorations from East Mesa. Posters will be made and posted each day.

Because of low registration, Harmony wellness will not be at the Gold Canyon campus in July.

The Summer Celebration was discussed. The date is August 4th from 6 – 8 in order to give **people from East Mesa a chance to get out to Gold Canyon after the 4 o'clock service. Richard will provide music. Cunninghams will pick up pizza from Papa Murphy's. Mike** will take care of the drinks. Attendees will be asked to bring a salad or desert. We will play a game similar to Family Feud. Survey questions will be worked up and presented to the congregation to be used at the party. Prizes are being considered.

God's Work Our Hands in September will be "Packages From Home". This is a 501c3 organization that collects and distributes items to American servicemen and their service animals overseas. We will be collecting items and packaging them. Kim McCracken was given the lists of items being collected for the servicemen and their service animals. The VBS children will write notes to the soldiers or their service animals to be included in the packages and collect some of the items.

Worship times were discussed once again. Janice has received only two additional responses. A total of twelve responses were received. Three wanted to leave things as they have been, two chose Option A, three took Option B and 2 selected Option C. A motion was made, seconded and passed to change our service times to Option B. Pr. Bill will work on all the necessary details.

Pastors and Staff

Pr. Bill Mediacom has installed our internet line. We are contracted with CenturyLink through October 15th. Mediacom has agreed to provide our service for 2 month free if we have our service started earlier. They are going to install our service July 15th. Pr. Bill will be on vacation from July 16th through the 25th. Pr. Jack Wudel from the ELCA Mission Investment Fund, and Deb Hutterer will be supply preaching.

Pr. Tina baptized 4 young ladies aged 11 to 17 from the same family at East Mesa. She is on vacation July 9th to the 16th.

Kim McCracken brought us up to speed on the VBS at East Mesa. There were 40 kids and 20 volunteers. VBS was followed by a youth lock in. VBS will be reviewed at the service at East Mesa on July 24th. We are all invited to join them. Ice Cream will be served after the service. The Youth Gathering in Houston was great. Four young ladies from OSLC attended with Kim. The speakers and the music were wonderful. Confirmation is coming up and school starts July 24th in this district. Kim informed us that a friend of hers, a teacher from Cactus Jr. High School, was driving a church youth group van full of kids **when they were involved in an accident. Five of the youth were injured and Kim's friend was killed.** A discussion was held concerning what we as a church could do to help her family. A motion was made, seconded and passed to inform the congregation through several forms of communication of this tragedy and offer them a way to help financially.

Dave Reurink let us know all the toilets in the building are working as they should. The AC is out everywhere except the sanctuary, again! He is looking at four options to solve this problem: 1) Replace the systems; 2) transfer to using just one of the two units; 3) Repair the existing systems, again; 4) purchase two split systems to be set up outside the rooms on the West and South sides. These would be in-wall units that would operate independently for each set of rooms. AT&T has fixed their roof.

Ministry Chair Reports (only those with current activity are shown below)

Discipleship – Suzy Cavoto - Bible Study starts Tuesday with Daniel. Attendance has been up since moving it to 10:30. Pr. Bill is still looking at a spring trip to Israel.

Finance – Pr. Bill pointed out that the unrestricted funds were at \$125,000 at the end of June. This is very good.

Missions – Janice and Robert Cunningham delivered 29 additional cases of water to Heat Respite at Grace Lutheran Church in downtown Phoenix. Eileen and Dave joined them and took a tour of the Heat Respite area and the sanctuary at Grace. Pr. Bill was asked to check on the possibility and cost of purchasing a pallet of water to be delivered to Grace **from Sam's Club.**

Property Team – Robert Cunningham reported that our garbage cans are back. Somehow **the bill hadn't been paid and the cans were removed by RAD. Leonard is still working on the gate.**

WELCA - Susan Drane reported that WELCA is currently holding a Bible Study on the 4th Monday of each month at East Mesa.

WORSHIP – Anita reported her group is talking about some banner changes for this fall.

Our next meeting is on August 7th, 2018 at 5:30pm.

We adjourned at 7:20 with the Lord's Prayer.

Call to Order: Ron Rock called the Council meeting to order at 7 pm.

Devotions: Pr. Bill gave the devotion and led us in prayer.

Agenda: A motion was made to accept the agenda. Passed.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the May regular Council Meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Motion made and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Staff Reports: Pr. Bill reported that the Discipleship Team is working on a trip to Israel in 2019. The cost of the trip would be \$500 less if taken the first 2 weeks in November rather than the last 2 weeks in October. He wondered if this would be a concern as the November trip would be the first 2 weeks of high season. A discussion was held and a motion made to approve the trip for November. Motion passed. Pr. Bill outlined his vacation plans for the remainder of the year.

Pr. Tina informed us that 4 young women were baptized in June. She is attending Stevens Ministry Training Sunday, August 5th returning Sunday August 12th. As a member of the Synod Council she will be attending a retreat at the Spirit of Hope Church October 4th thru the 6th. Sept 8th Pr. Deb Hutterer will be installed at Shepard of the Valley in Glendale.

Kim McCracken submitted a written report. She also presented a new MOU for IHELP and Family Resource (formerly Family Spot) to name the Gold Canyon Campus an emergency site. Motion made to approve and passed. A Continuing Resolution was presented and passed allowing the Boy Scouts to sell Christmas Wreaths. Kim requested permission to attend a Cross + Gen Life Conference in Estes Park Co. Motion made and passed to send both her and Pr. Tina. Discussion was held concerning Women in Gratitude AA group requesting to meet at East Mesa August 7th, 14th and 21st from 6:30 to 7:30 pm. Motion made and defeated.

Dave Reurink let us know the up-lights in the chapel at East Mesa will be installed next week, and the sound system there was repaired. A bid from Mason Mechanical to replace the AC units at Gold Canyon was presented and approved by a motion. A non-slip surface will be placed on the 3 isles in the chapel.

President's Report – Ron Rock reviewed the ongoing issue of the parking lot at East Mesa. A motion was made and passed to obtain a drainage plan to solve the problems.

Gold Canyon Coordinating Committee: Report submitted.

Evangelism: Ruthie let us know there were 3 new members at East Mesa.

New Business: Janice reported that an owner of a columbarium niche has changed churches and does not intend to use this niche. Janice suggested that the purchase price less the cost of a new face plate, be refunded to the owners. The inscribed faceplate would be returned to them. Motion made and passed.

Next Council Meeting, August 21st, 2018 at East Mesa.

We adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 9:45 pm.

Important Information from Your Council President

As your congregational president, it is my responsibility to keep you informed of issues of importance to the congregation. About two weeks ago, I was made aware of an agreement between Our Savior's and Maricopa county.

In 2007, when we decided to pave the west parking lot, we requested both the dry-well contractor and the paving contractor to secure permits for construction. Even though the project was completed, the permits were never secured.

In 2012, when we installed the solar panels, Maricopa county required a signed contract to correct water retention issues at our EM campus to issue permits. Our agreement included penalties for missed deadlines, including a \$50/day fine beginning in April 2013. This fine would continue to accumulate until project completion.

In 2012, the council was in the process of obtaining the permits, however; given the upheaval in the congregation on many levels and the significant cost of the project, it was not completed.

Maricopa county is in the process of reviewing compliance agreements over five years old. We would have been shortly receiving our fine. Applying for the sign permits did two things: 1. It alerted us to the existence of the 2012 Compliance Agreement with Maricopa county; and 2. It moved our file from "on the way to penalty billing" to "permit pending."

Unbeknownst to us, this could not have been better timing. When we asked the head of permitting regarding the penalties, he said, "get the permits, do the work, and the penalties go away." It was difficult to contain the joy over hearing those words! Of course, if we don't do the work, the penalties continue to accumulate.

So, we are currently in the process of having the engineering studies done to secure the necessary permits. The county will only issue the sign permit at the same time we obtain a parking lot permit.

We have no choice but to complete this project. If we don't correct this problem, the implications are clearly spelled out in the 2012 Compliance Agreement, which states the penalties will continue to accrue until successful completion of the project. As soon as we have the permits and can obtain bids, we will be bringing a construction proposal to you for your approval at a specially called congregational meeting.

Again, we need to remember the good news: 1. We caught this before the accumulated penalties were enforced; 2. We can avoid ANY penalties if we complete the project; 3. Both us and our neighbors can rest easy, knowing that we will be able to sustain a 100-year water event.

Thank you both for understanding and for your continued support. Please know that we are trying to do the best we can given the circumstances in which we find ourselves together.

We will keep you updated as more information becomes available.
