Laayna presented an outline of the Tirosh Youth Gatherin to be held January 19<sup>th</sup> -21<sup>st</sup>.

Call to Order: Ron Rock called the Council meeting to order at 7:10 pm at the East Mesa campus. Pr. Rindy led us in prayer.

Agenda: A motion was made to accept the agenda. Passed.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the November regular Council Meeting were approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** Cindy Reichert presented the treasurer's report. Some discussion was held. Motion made and passed to accept. The Finance Committee continues to work on the 2019 Mission Plan.

Staff Reports: Pr. Bill reported Pr. Terry Petkovic is unavailable as a seasonable pastor this high season. A motion was presented, seconded and passed to empower the Executive Committee, in concert with the pastors to contract a pastor to fill in where needed.

Pr. Tina – All is scheduled from the Blue Christmas service through the weekend.

Kim McCracken submitted a written report. The VA wants to do something in the first quarter of 2019. Angle tree was successful. There will be a candle lighting ceremony on the last night of Tirosh. The council was encouraged to attend. The Superstition Foothills COA has request meeting space at Gold Canyon for their monthly homeowners meeting. Kim will work up a MOU.

Presidents Report: Ron Rock let us know that there is no acid test yet on the parking lot area at East Mesa.

East Mesa Coordinating Committee: A written report was submitted by Cindy Reichert. Mike let us know there will be an usher meeting on January 29<sup>th</sup>. Bazaar items can be dropped off after the Christmas weekend. The Bazaar will be January 25<sup>th</sup>/26<sup>th</sup>.

Gold Canyon Coordinating Committee: A written report was submitted by Mike Johnson. Janice requested approval for funds to purchase a choir step. Motion made, seconded and passed to spend not over \$1,000.

Administration – Susan Drain No report.

WELCA – Susan Drane – Submitted a written report. \$5,000 was collected for gift cards for schools. Unused Christmas cards are being collected to sell at the gift shop.

Dave Reurink – East Mesa: The new stoves will be delivered soon. There was a problem with one solar inverter that he fixed. Fencing will be installed to keep people off the roof. There was one bid for \$600 to place concrete for the trash containers. He is **getting bids for roof repair. The “safe room” is being reconstructed. An electrician will call Robert to meet concerning the lights at Gold Canyon.**

Missions Richard Falk- 336 pounds of canned goods were collected by the carolers. This went to the AJ Food Bank. He is working on a proposal for a Thanksgiving dinner at East Mesa next year. He is also working on a foreign coin exchange. Janice asked if anyone had signed up for the trip to the Native American Mission Church next Saturday. He said he had not received the information Janice sent. He does not have e-mail so in order to reach him you must call.

New Business: None

Pr. Tina closed with prayer. We adjourned at 830 pm.

1. Mike Johnson provided us with an invocation.

2. New Business:

a. The choir needs some type of handrail to the second level of the risers. Robert Cunningham will check to see if he can find the manufacturer. There may be an attachable railing to fit this purpose.

b. Karen Howard would like to see the Christmas Potluck reinstated. She is looking at January 20th as the date. The Coordinating Committee voiced support. Mike Johnson and Robert Cunningham will help with set up and take down. Karen will check with the Women's Bible Study for coordinating help.

c. Reinstating Suppers for 6 was discussed. Janice will check with Dorothy Homann to see if she would be willing to coordinate these again. If not, Karen Howard will check with Norma Elser to see if they can work together to start them up again.

3. Old Business: The toilets in the Men's Room and the Ladies' Room by the front gate are not working correctly.

4. Pastors and Staff

a. Pr. Bill says all the normal things are happening. Gold Canyon and East Mesa internet speed is finally the same. There are some staff issues. Sonya accepted her position as part time and has had additional duties assigned to her since coming on board. Her travel time takes up much of the time she could be working on projects for OSL or some of her other clients. She has requested to be allowed to work more often from home. The need for paid staff to be on site Monday through Friday was discussed. It's extremely rare that any members of the congregation or of the public in general stop by. Vendors or repair people come by appointment and there are policies in place to admit them. There is also a sign by the front gate providing a number to call if anyone needs access at any other time. The Committee commented that with Prayer Shawl in the building on Monday mornings, Bible Study on Tuesdays, Gold Dusters and Snack Pack groups on Thursdays and Choir on Friday the only time it might be necessary to have someone on site would be Wednesday. Rather than to have someone from East Mesa come out to Gold Canyon and not be productive, the committee decided that if a volunteer could be found to come in on Wednesdays, appropriate coverage would be provided. Mike Johnson volunteered to come into the office on Wednesdays. He will start Wednesday, December 14th. Angela will take care of getting Mike a fob and an alarm code. Pr. Terry's hearing has returned to almost 50%.

b. Pr. Tina reviewed transition to three Sunday services at Gold Canyon. There were no ushers or communion servers signed up for 730am or 1030am. The pastors will need to be more flexible and ask for volunteers during the services.

c. Kim McCracken provided a written report. East Mesa is a voting site. There was some confusion with I-Help. There may be a need to move the I-Help women to Gold Canyon if this is a problem in the future. January 30th is the Christmas program at Gold Canyon. It will be held at the 10:30 service.

d. Dave Reurink will work on the toilet issue. The lights above the forum room door are fixed. (YEA!) The church's insurance company is Church Mutual. They will be doing another walk through at both campuses this Thursday afternoon to review storm damage. Guide One Insurance Company is providing us with a quote. Dave was asked to arrange for the RO filters to be changed.

5. Ministry Chair Reports (only those with current activity are shown below)

a. Care Deb Herman will send another card to Dorothy Homann.

b. Discipleship Suzy Cavoto will attend the Discipleship meeting tomorrow.

c. Evangelism – Mike Johnson will work on getting the Gold Canyon schedule in all local publications.

d. Finance – John Malmberg informed us that expenses were lower than the budget so far this year. The General Fund contributions are up \$12,000 from the budgeted amount but the Building Fund is down \$6,000. Overall, we are up about \$6,000 in contribution.

e. Good News – Mike Johnson visited with a couple Saturday night who have just bought in the Gold Canyon area and are looking for a church. He asked if we could have new member information printed periodically to keep with our picture directories.

f. Missions – The mission for October was the Native American Urban Mission Church. The check should be ready soon. Janice and Robert will deliver this check. Everyone was invited to attend. There will be a Mission meeting on December 20th at 1:00pm at East Mesa.

g. Property Team – Robert Cunningham let us know the new banner showing High Season service times has been placed; a cleanup day for the landscaping was set for Saturday January 15th. The ice maker has also been repaired and is working well. Leonard has purchased the paint for the parking bumpers. Kim will check to see if any of the youth groups would like to paint the bumpers as a project.

h. WELCA Marcie Mesker said the Advent Breakfast is set for January 1st at 9:00 am in the Community Room at East Mesa. The tickets are \$10.00 and are available from her or Jan Malmberg. The Angel Tree will be set up and decorating will be done December 30th. The names of about 60 children from Peralta Trail Elementary School and Desert Vista Elementary School will be placed on the tree. Gifts need to be returned the weekend of January 15th/16th. There is a \$30 limit per child. A Santa hat will be placed on the tree for cash donations. The Prayer Shawl group will divide the gifts and attach a hat to each one. They will deliver the packages on Monday, January 17th.

Our next meeting is on January 4th, 2018 at 5:30pm. Janice and Robert will be out of town. The meeting will be conducted by Mike Johnson.

We adjourned at 7:30 pm with the Lord's Prayer.

Pastor Bill opened with prayer.

Laayna Carstensen presented information on Tirosh, a spiritual retreat that will be attended by 4 of our youth. The event will be held at King of Glory Lutheran Church in Tempe on January 19-21.

### Family Promise - Robin

The Covenant with Family Promise was discussed and approved with the revision specifying OSLC will host families 2-4 weeks per year. The next Family Promise events are scheduled for February 17-24 and August 18-25.

### I-Help - Linda

The I-Help ladies will be housed on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve and New Year's Day, since the holidays fall on Monday and Tuesday of each week this year.

Discipleship/Youth Activities— Kim The EM Dinner & A Movie, held on November 8th went well with approximately 24 in attendance. **The movie was "Gattaca". Great discussion was held following the movie.** 50 volunteers gathered at Feed My Starving Children on November 21 to package food for the less fortunate. Angel Tree tags were put out the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> of December at both campuses. Gifts are due back the weekend of December 15 -16. Poinsettias were sold at both campuses. Sunday, December 23 , a cross- generational Christmas program will be held at 10:30 with cookies and hot chocolate following. A similar program will be held on December 30<sup>th</sup> at Gold Canyon.

### WELCA/Administration –Susan
