I-Help – Linda

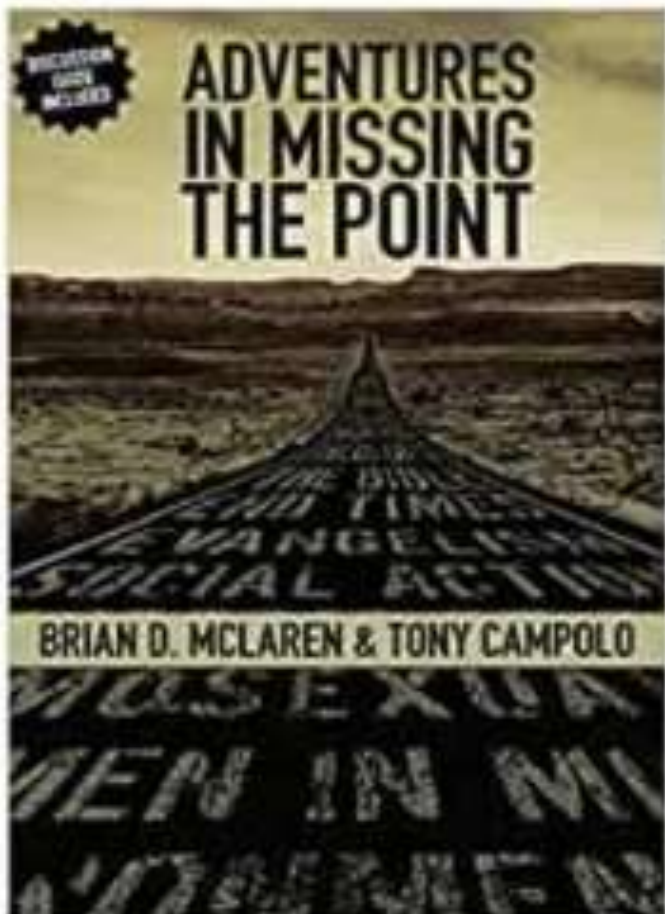
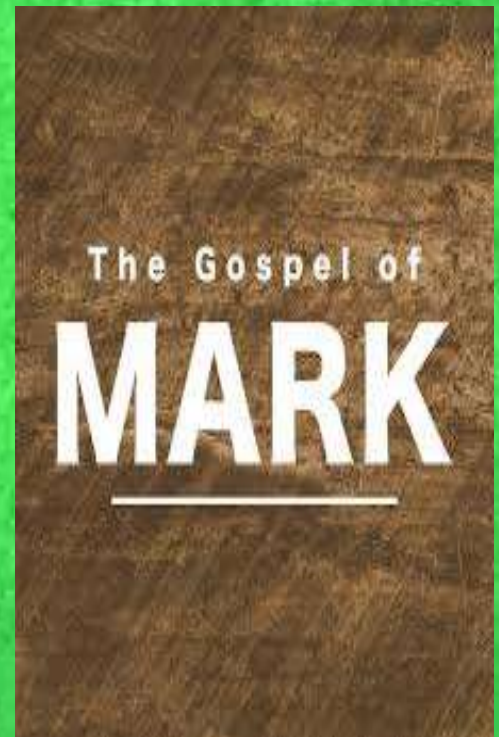

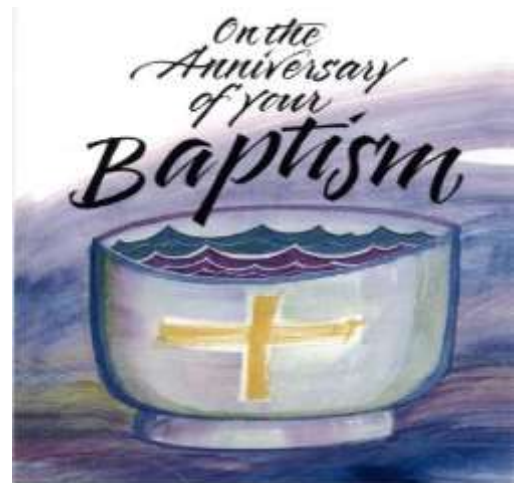
