Rough Roof



The recent storms have brought much needed rain to our desert environment.

They have also brought our attention to some needed roof repairs at the East Mesa campus.

There are several sections of the roof that are leaking. There are also sections of the roof that need to be replaced due to the age of the current roof.

The leaks are being repaired as quickly as possible. The work on that will begin in September, and for now there is a tarp covering the worst of the leaks.

The rest of the roof repairs have been prioritized by severity of need, but they all need to be addressed as soon as possible.

The exact cost of the repairs and replacement is not known at this time. The immediate repairs will be approximately \$20,000. The council is trying to get multiple bids for the replacements that are not as urgent, but that cost will be approximately \$70,000.

There are several ways the congregation can be a part of fixing and maintaining the roof. First, please pray that we are able to address the leaks quickly and without additional problems, like mold growth, becoming an issue. Second, if you have skills and abilities in building maintenance and would be willing to help with maintenance or clean up, please let the office know. Third, please contemplate contributing financially to the repairs to the East Mesa roof.

If you are not able to increase your giving currently, we understand. Please continue making your current contributions to the general fund. If you are able to make an additional offering towards the roof repair, we rejoice with you for God's abundance.

Thank you for walking this path of discipleship with us!

Reminders

We are all grateful to be back in worship singing and praying out loud. We all rejoice that we were able to let go of the tight restrictions we had for a time. Yet the Covid-19 virus and its variants are still a part of the world we live in, so we do want to remind everyone of the ways we are still working to protect one another.

-There is hand sanitizer available at the entrances and exits.

-At both the Gold Canyon and East Mesa campuses, there are sections of the sanctuary that are set aside for greater distance between worshipers and mask wearing. If you sit in these sections, please wear a mask.

-The CDC recommends that those who are not vaccinated do wear masks and maintain a 6 foot distance.

-The CDC is now recommending that all people wear masks when they attend indoor worship, even if they are vaccinated.

-Please notify the office if you have been diagnosed with Covid-19 following attendance at worship. These results will not be shared, they will be used to watch for any indication that people contracted the virus at worship.

Cases of Covid-19 are on the rise in our area. People who are vaccinated make up a low percentage of those new cases. Given the increase in cases we do want you to be aware of the change in recommendations from the CDC.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE July 20, 2021, COUNCIL MEETING: Ruth Parker moved to accept the June 15, 2021, minutes and was seconded by Suzy Cavoto. MC

STAFF REPORTS:

Pastor Mills: 1. Pastor Tina and Kim McCracken have had persons contact them about Call Committee. 2. Because of technical problems there are phone and email issues along with documents that were saved to the cloud are disappearing. Phone system had to be reset for the past two weeks. AZURE (the cloud-based system) was taken off and then put back on the 3CX server. That hasn't solved the problem so phone system will be moved back to AZURE, which is a Microsoft program that is cloud-based. 3. Attended Council Synod on Saturday, Aug. 14. (A) Synod is partnering with the Rocky Mountain Synod in Growing Generously that is partly funded with a Lilley Grant. This will be used to support Pastors (student loans or medical debt). (B) Growing Ministries to foster a ministry group for advocacy for people experiencing homelessness and the elderly. (C) Bishop Hutterer's letter regarding the wearing of masks. As of right now we will continue with how we are handling the situation and place signs with the CDC recommendations. 4. There are roof issues at East Mesa.

Kim McCracken: Provided a written report. CYF: 1. Kim and Pastor Tina met to discuss Affirmation. Will change to a one year program instead of two. Class will meet on Sunday after worship. 2. Kim will work with sister congregations to bring our small youth groups together. 3. WELCA: Susan Drane reported that The No-Bake Bake Sale netted \$1,590. The proceeds will be distributed to the Gold Canyon and East Mesa Food Banks.

OLD BUSINESS: 1: Update on Interim Pastor Contract. Pastor Nolan's first day with us will be Sept. 2, 2021. 2: Covid Task Force will meet on Thursday, Aug. 19 at 2pm. 3: Roof issues at East Mesa. One bid has been received. There are four major areas of concern. Beach Ventures has provided a bid of \$86,995 to repair the whole roof; but is willing to do the work in stages. MINISTRY CHAIR REPORTS: Only those with activities are reported below:

Care – We still need a chair for this group. Pr. Tina and Kim are working together until a chair can be named. Pr. Tina is looking for someone to send cards. The Grief Support is continuing to meet 10am Friday morning at the I-Hop on Southern and Signal Butte. The Stephen Ministry and Eucharistic Ministry are not active at this time.

Discipleship Carol Ronen commented on the Bible study that started today. A Discipleship meeting is set for August 16th.

Evangelism Leonard is registering OSL for the Festival of the Superstitions to be held in Apache Junction. He will need volunteers for supplying giveaways and to staff the table.

Finance – John is very concerned about contributions going into the general fund. Extrapolating our current giving out until the end of the year we would be about \$123,000 below 2019 and \$60,000 below 2020. This is a very serious problem.

Good News – We still need a chair for this position.

Missions - Ruth is on vacation. However, the count has not been done yet for month end. We do not have a total collected for the No Bake - Bake Sale.

Property – Leonard continues to work on cleaning up the courtyard. Robert reported all toilets are now working fine. The combination lock on the columbarium is not working and will be replaced. There was a flood in the kitchen. The Reverse Osmosis unit under the large sink had a leak. It was discovered by the Prayer Shawl ladies. Over an inch of water was on the kitchen floor. It ran out the door and down the edge of the sanctuary and out both sets of doors. Savon, the company that did the mold remediation came out and dried everything out. The bill was a bit over \$3,000. Janice will check with the insurance company to see if any of this is covered.

Old Business – Marian has suggested that people be encouraged to wear their name tags. Janice will place a list on the Welcome Table to ask for a new tag, ask for this item to be added to the ad loop and the Pastors will be asked to remind people. This will be especially important as we move into the time of having supply preachers and an Interim Pastor.

WELCA There was no report as the count was not done for the month of July.

We spent a few minutes thanking Pr. Bill for his service and reviewing the plan for his last Sunday on August 8th.

Pr. Bill reminded us that as Moses said to Joshua, “Be strong, be courageous. Strength is in the Lord. He then closed us with prayer.

Volunteers are needed for four teams. Most teams are needed for only two hours.

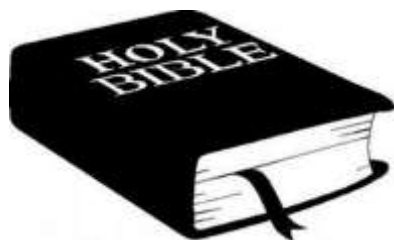
The FOOD team will prepare dinner for each evening, serve it, and clean up afterwards. Food teams will be needed for each evening. The BED team will bring beds and laundry from the basement up and set up air mattresses on Sunday, September 19th. 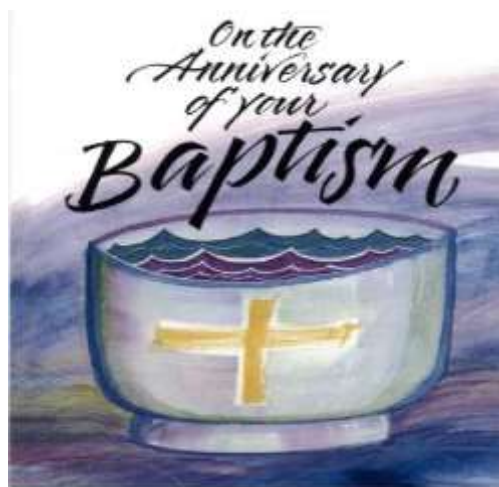
